DIPLOMA OF AVIATION COMMERCIAL PILOT LICENCE - AEROPLANE

YOUR GATEWAY TO A CAREER IN AVIATION

A *Commercial Pilot Licence* (CPL) is the initial benchmark licence for working in the aviation industry as a pilot. Commercial pilots are permitted to earn money from flying, eg working for hire or as an employee. Commercial pilots are authorised to act as pilot in command for aircraft only requiring one pilot, or as co-pilot for aircraft requiring two pilots.

The diploma qualification, together with the CPL, will provide you with the qualifications, skills, knowledge and experience to operate as a commercial pilot and to seek initial employment in various roles ¹.

COURSE OUTCOMES

On successful completion of the full course, students will attain:

- an AVI50215 **Diploma of Aviation** (Commercial Pilot Licence – Aeroplane) – a nationally recognised qualification
- an Australian **Private Pilot Licence** (PPL) issued by the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA)²
- an Australian **Commercial Pilot Licence** (CPL) issued by CASA²

DURATION

This course is offered as a full-time intensive over 40 weeks³, with five days participation per week. We schedule several student intakes per calendar year—see our website for details.

STRUCTURE

The Diploma course is comprised of 28 core units and one elective unit. The units cover all relevant competencies, knowledge and skills for a commercial pilot and correlate with PPL and CPL licence requirements. See training.gov.au for further information on the units.

The course is a blend of theoretical, practical and self-guided learning, together with assessment. The timetable is carefully designed to assist students to progress through the learning and assessment requirements in an achievable and meaningful way.

A typical week of study generally involves:

- attending scheduled theory classes
- participating in flight training in aircraft and simulators
- attending pre and post-flight briefings
- undertaking guided self-study and assessment preparation.

The course is primarily in-person (face-to-face) learning with interactive classroom work and individual time with an instructor. Much of the course content is also available online and in printed study guides to support student self-study.
