Many of our aircraft have advanced avionics suitable for various flight operations and training contexts. Our larger commercial aircraft provide students with valuable experience in aircraft operated commercially throughout Australia.

Our simulators


Simulator based learning is integrated into our training, providing an authentic and safe environment for practice and familiarisation. We have simulators approved for Instrument Training, as well as a 737 Simulator, (1:1 scale replica) for students to use.

Maintenance

We have both CAR30 and CASR Part 145 Maintenance approvals and our aircraft are serviced in accordance with the Australian Government Civil Aviation Safety Authority's Maintenance Standards.

We have a variety of aircraft types coupled with modern facilities and you will be flying in one of the most scenic and diverse aviation environments in the world. More time flying, less time waiting

Cambridge Aerodrome is only 15 minutes drive from the city of Hobart and is a low density traffic aerodrome, almost solely dedicated to use by our organisation. Having lower traffic levels means that your flying time and hands-on training is maximised in every flight hour.

In comparison to many mainland centres, our airspace is relatively open and less busy. You will spend more time in the air and less time taxiing, waiting for clearances and holding at crowded holding points. In comparison to aerodromes such as Moorabbin (Melbourne) or Bankstown (Sydney), this can mean a significant time and cost saving for students.

Well-equipped training fleet

Ab-initio training (ie for those new to flying) is conducted in the latest model Cessna 172 'S' models. The Cessna 172 (the world's most popular and versatile training aircraft) with its high wing design and modern avionics is ideal for training students.

Commercial training is conducted in a Cessna 206 aircraft, an aircraft routinely used for single engine commercial operations throughout Australia and around the world. This gives the student experience in a real world commercial aircraft.

Students gain experience with basic and advanced Garmin GPS systems in their training, as well as ample hands-on flying in a variety of training scenarios and exercises.

Weather for all types of training

Flying in Tasmania offers a unique combination of weather, airspace and topography that is ideal for authentic and varied flight training. Over summer, we have the longest hours of daylight in the country, which means more flying opportunities. We have a generally moderate climate and temperature extremes are rare.

Tasmania's weather and seasonal changes offer useful opportunities to gain experience in many types of weather conditions when training. While 'cold and wet' may spring to mind, the reality is that our state is surprisingly sunny and dry in comparison to many parts of Australia.

Instrument Flight Rules (IFR) conditions can often be experienced in Tasmania. This makes actual IFR training/practice and instrument approach training/practice a reality, meaning that your training is more authentic and aligned with real-world operations.

Real terrain, real learning

You will be flying over varied terrain within Tasmania including mountains, islands, remote areas and the sea. There are opportunities to experience flying in other parts of the country with navigation exercises taking place across the Bass Strait to mainland states of Australia.

Airport and airspace variety

Your flights will include major airports in Hobart and Launceston, regional airports in Devonport and Wynyard and many smaller airports and country airstrips throughout the state and Bass Strait. You will gain valuable experience and confidence as you fly into some of the remote and challenging airfields around Tasmania. Tasmania's airspace includes air traffic services at two Class D towered airports, with the remainder managed by Melbourne Air Traffic Control, in both radar and non-radar airspace.

Real industry experience

Our instructors work across the many divisions of our company and bring a wealth of multi-faceted real world commercial aviation experience to your training.

Flying training is a specialised field that requires professionalism and a real emphasis on safety. Our staff are dedicated career instructors with a wealth of experience in all aspects of general aviation. All our staff are committed to providing students with the highest quality training together with the highest safety standards.

Our staff regularly build and improve their aviation qualifications and competencies, together with their teaching and assessment skills and knowledge. Our courses are designed and supported by education professionals with a strong emphasis on effective and efficient learning.

Much of our training is conducted in-person (face-to-face) with small class sizes and one-to-one learning with instructors in the aircraft, in simulators and at pre and post-flight briefings.
